

Ringings, Holt Island, 6th July 2018

Another fine day which started a little cloudy. This was another short session in the early morning packing up at 10 am.

All the new birds were juveniles, with very few adults being caught, and they were all re-traps.

Again the catch was predominantly Great Tits and Blue Tits but there were good numbers of juvenile Warblers.

A Blue Tit was caught which was ringed in the summer of 2014 and a Dunnock from January 2015

Also seen were Small White, Small Tortoiseshell, Comma, Holly Blue, Red Admiral and Meadow Brown. Yesterday a Ghost Swift moth was caught and a young Toad found. The numbers of Harlequin Ladybirds has risen this year. The Greater Dodder is present on the Meadow.
