

RINGING ON HOLT ISLAND 6TH NOVEMBER 2020

The weather was calm, cold and clear. We had an interesting catch, with a first record for the Island, namely a Woodcock, a very handsome wader which must have been looking to feed in the soft ground following the brief flood.

The Cetti's Warbler first ringed in September is still on the Island and so are the Goldcrests ringed in October, both were re-trapped along with a new one.

One of the Blue Tits re-trapped was originally ringed in nesting box No 9.

One thing that was noticeable with the re-traps was the most had been caught several times this year and were therefore faithful to the site.
