## WICKEN FEN (BIRD RINGING) GROUP Brief news for April 2018

There were netting sessions at the Fen on 9 different days in March – but, with the exception of a single, brief, "Wiffwaff challenge", all were at the St. Edmund's Fen sites. The month's ringing total was 82; a further 87 different birds were retrapped, so the overall total for the month was 169.
