

## RINGING ON HOLT ISLAND 1<sup>ST</sup> – 2<sup>ND</sup> JUNE 2017

The weather for the two days was warm, still, and dry, the morning of the 2<sup>nd</sup> was somewhat overcast. A third of the birds were newly ringed.

A pleasing number of Warblers were caught including some ringed four years ago (a Reed Warbler and a Blackcap) All four of the Sedge Warblers ringed last month were still present and appear to be breeding.

We also re-trapped five out of six of the Great Tit fledglings from box 22. It is very noticeable that the numbers of Great Tits have increased significantly compared with the number of Blue Tits caught.

The Great Spotted Woodpecker was a last year's bird and was in suspended moult

As well as the birds we noted a number of Red Admiral butterflies, Specked Wood and Green veined White. A snout moth was also seen
