

WICKEN FEN GROUP Brief news for September 2018

There were ringing sessions at the Fen on 9 different days in September the final CES sessions, additional roost sessions (highlighted) and sessions with feeders and tape lures. The month's ringing total was 564; a further 140 different birds were retrapped, so the overall total for the month was 704. Interesting observations

Both Baker's Fen and Burwell Fen still had no open water meaning few counts of wildfowl or waders.

Cormorant on Burwell Fen maximum 11 on the 16th.

Crane 3 on the 16th.

Green Sandpiper on Burwell Fen one on the 7th then 2 on the 22nd and 24th.

Greenshank Burwell Fen 3 on the 22nd and one on the 24th.

Short-eared Owl Burwell Fen on the 12th and 21st and Wicken Fen on the 24th.

Hobby last on the 16th.

Whinchat 3 on Verrall's Fen on the 3rd.

Wheatear one on the 24th and on the 29th.
